

WEBINAR DESCRIPTION:

As a Human Factors Expert, Dr. Bong Walsh has been involved in many cases where a motor vehicle accident was blamed on a driver because the driver had alcohol, marijuana, or another substance in his/her system. Much of the time, the blame or "cause" is seemingly automatic or by default due to the presence of the substance. Using examples from actual cases that he has been involved with, Dr.

Walsh will present practical information on defending drivers in situations where a result is blamed on driver impairment despite a lack of substantive evidence of a causal relationship between the presence of the substance and the driver's actions or eventual result. Dr. Walsh will also present information specific to the interpretation of THC metabolite levels, using results and figures from peer-reviewed scientific journal articles.

PRESENTER: DR. BONG WALSH



Bong J. Walsh was born and raised in San Francisco, CA. He received his B.S. in Biopsychology from UC Santa Barbara in 1994, then worked at UCSF in gene therapy for two years, followed by work in the biotech industry for several years. Following this, he attended graduate school in Neuroscience at UC Davis, where he received his Ph.D. in Cognitive Neuroscience in 2008. After a brief post-doctoral fellowship, he joined the Psychology Department at UC Davis, teaching the Cognitive Psychology and Cognitive Neuroscience courses. In 2012, he joined the Core Faculty at the American School of Professional Psychology where he taught several courses, including Cognitive and Affective Bases of Behavior, Physiological Psychology, and Psychopharmacology. In

2017, Bong joined Boster, Kobayashi, and Associates, where he has been retained as a Human Factors Expert in hundreds of cases, many of which have involved alcohol and other substances as potential contributing factors. Among many committee memberships, he has been a full member of the Transportation Research Board (TRB) Standing Committee on Alcohol, Other Drugs, and Performance since 2019.

5.) QUESTION OF THE MONTH: WHO IS KUWATCH?



Each year CDLA presents the Edward Kuwatch Memorial Award to recognize the attorney who made the greatest contribution and the most significant impact to the DUI field. The award was established to honor the memory of Edward "Fast Eddy" Kuwatch, a prominent attorney and founder of the California DUI Deuce Defenders (now called

the CDLA). Edward Kuwatch was an outstanding leader within the legal profession and in the community.



Edward Kuwatch passed away on February 26, 2005 at the young age of 58. A View Nam Veteran who served on the USS Sea Leopard as a Communications Operator from 1965 to 1971, he was regarded as California's foremost expert on DUI Law and an author of numerous California Law Books. In 2002, he ran for the office of California Attorney General.

The award carries on this tradition and recognizes a lawyer who provides exceptional service to the field of DUI & DMV Defense. The Edward Kuwatch Memorial Award will be presented at the Annual Awards Luncheon to be held on Saturday, August 12 2023 at the 2023 Annual Kuwatch Conference held at the Omni Los Angeles hotel.

6.) MEMBER SPOTLIGHT: RICHARD MIDDLEBROOK





I grew up in a low-income housing project in San Diego with an amazing single mom, brother and sister. While I received college acceptances at both big name and Ivy League schools, I chose California Lutheran University in a combination of youthful indifference and need to be a big fish in a little pond. It was one of the best accidents of my life. Never stopped running with that theme into law school (which I hated every day of and have officially blocked out virtually all memory of), I chose the smallest University of California law school class in Davis

I've tried over 280 DUI trials and have been honored to have obtained some wonderful education from some of the best lawyers and scientists in the world. I am grateful to have received the ACS-

CHAL Lawyer Scientist Designation from the American Chemical Society, a Martingale.com AV rating and being named a Southern California SuperLawyer for nearly 15-years.

But my greatest source of pride will always be my amazing daughter Mason who is a 16-year old better version of me. Nothing has ever mattered more or given me more joy. We spend our time traveling (currently 87 countries) and being slaves to our Golden Retrievers, Tucker and Finn.
